Selection of students

A limited number of students are accepted annually, proportional to the number of clinical placement sites accredited with the Professional Board of Radiography and Clinical Technology of the Health Professions Council of South Africa. Higher levels in your subjects mean a student stands a greater chance of being accepted. Final selection takes place in September and successful applicants will be notified in writing by November. A visit to an accredited x-ray department is recommended for all prospective applicants.

Radiography programme

The Bachelor of Radiography is offered as a four-year full-time professional degree. During the periods when students are not attending lectures at the university, they visit an accredited training institution for their experiential training.

Students are registered with the Health Professions Council of South Africa. Upon qualification, all newly qualified radiographers are required by law to undertake one year's community service.

Admission requirements

- Minimum NSC statutory requirements for degree entry must be met.
- An applicant with NSC Grade 12 Mathematics requires a minimum Applicant Score of 390.
- NSC achievement rating of at least 50% for Mathematics.
- NSC achievement rating of at least 50% for Physical Sciences.
- NSC achievement rating of at least 50% for Life Sciences.
- Admission is subject to Departmental selection.
- Applicants must also be physically fit.
- Applicants referred for selection must submit a satisfactory medical report, on the prescribed form, to the Admission Office.
